Benefits of Lesson Objectives

- 1.Helps to focus your lesson and keep the end goal in mind.**
- 2.Students clearly understand what you want them to accomplish each day.**
- 3.Opens communication to anyone entering the classroom--everyone knows the end goal.**



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When writing your lesson objectives, you want to ask yourself a couple of questions to help you establish what the lesson objective should actually consist of.

Lesson Objectives

1. What do I want my students to be able to do by the end of this lesson?
2. How will I know that they can do it?

**SWBAT (Students Will Be Able To).....VERB.....SPECIFIC SKILL.....MEASURE
(80%).....as demonstrated by.....FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT**

SWBAT create equivalent fractions using fraction strips with 80% accuracy,
as demonstrated by the Lesson 3 Exit Ticket.

SWBAT define and identify figurative language (hyperbole, euphemisms)
with 80% accuracy as demonstrated via an exit ticket.
